You might be wondering what animal law is all about. At the simplest level, animal law relates to laws that concern the interests of animals. However, animal law is concerned not only with animal protection and welfare laws, but also involves considering animal interests in a socio-legal context and critically examining the ethical and moral underpinning of laws relating to animals.

We believe it is important to ask questions, such as should animals have rights? If so, what should be the nature of those rights? How should we balance human and animal interests in society? Are animal protection laws adequately enforced? How can the law be improved to better protect animals? Are animal interests adequately represented in our legal and political machinery? How should the law reflect the inter-connectedness between animals, environment, and ecosystems?

A-LAW is a legal charity. Our vision is a world where animal interests are adequately protected by law. We require that members support our vision, but there is no additional membership requirement. We respect the fact that our members have different views on a range of issues from veganism to animal rights.


We want the Student Group to be an accessible hub of information and opportunities for students.
